

Prospect Fellowships: second round 10 additional post-doctoral fellowships in WA

In response to the increasing uncertainty of funding for early-career researchers, the Forrest Research Foundation is offering a further 10 Prospect Fellowships to exceptional recent PhD graduates to undertake cutting-edge research in Western Australia.

This second round of Prospect Fellowships is open to candidates who have completed their PhD on or after 1 August 2019 and who are Australian or New Zealand citizens or Australian permanent residents.

Prospect Fellowships are of 18 months duration, and can be held at any of Western Australia's five universities.

Applicants must have an outstanding academic profile, and may come from any disciplinary background, but must undertake research focused on one of:

- Indian Ocean (to include e.g. marine science and engineering, geo-politics, economics)
- Agriculture, food and nutrition
- Environment and natural resources (to include e.g. extractive industries, ecology, conservation)

- Frontier technologies (to include e.g. space science, AI, bio-engineering, nanotechnology)
- Mental and physical health and well-being (to include e.g. medicine, human biosciences)
- Arts and culture

Prospect Fellows will be based in research groups with: international research reputations; ongoing cross-institutional partnerships and collaborations; success in translating research into policy, practice or industry application; and a track record of supporting and promoting career development of early-stage researchers.

The Fellowships will favour candidates who intend to build on existing research infrastructure, skills and projects located in Western Australia, and who can demonstrate the potential impact of their research on the WA community, society or economy.
